ABOUT THE COURSE

Alternative Dispute Resolution is a technique for dispute resolution of disputes outside the courts. These techniques are most encouraging and prospective option for resolution of disputes in India and USA. Arbitration is the most preferred option as it is a speedy remedy since invariably rules of evidence and procedure are far more flexible; there are no crowded dockets; arbitrators have expertise in the commercial issues being addressed; there can be high levels of confidentiality and privacy; corruption and political overreach are minimal; and the parties can choose laws and procedures to be applied. With the globalization, liberalization and rapid growth of international trade, international disputes are resolved through International Commercial Arbitration. For a country like India with its burgeoning cases waiting to be disposed and limited judicial outreach arbitration can be valuable. The Course will cover the emerging issues and challenges for effective dispute resolution through alternative techniques in India and USA.
