

**REPORT ON NATIONAL E-SEMINAR ON “THE SOCIOECONOMIC
TRANSFORMATION IN INDIA: PROSPECTS AND STRATEGIES IN POST
PANDEMIC ERA”**

The Centre for Advanced Studies in Labour Welfare (CASLW) organized the National E-Seminar on “The Socioeconomic Transformation in India: Prospects and Strategies in Post Pandemic Era” on April 24, 2021.
