CONCEPT NOTE

BACKGROUND

"All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights."

The notion of identity is essential to the dignity and self-respect of any person. This includes sexual identity as well. The transgender community has faced centuries of oppression, which has made it difficult for them to come to establish their identity and enjoy their rights. The *NALSA Judgment* of 2014 was a ray of hope in an otherwise dark period for the Trans community. This judgement recognized the rights of transgender persons to gender identity, freedom of speech and expression, relying on the golden trinity of Articles 14, 19 and Article 21 of the Constitution. However, rights pertaining to marriage, divorce, inheritance or adoption, is still governed by limited imagination and understanding of gender. It is evident from the treatment meted out to LGBTQ+ community as well. In this context, the decriminalisation of homosexuality in the *Navtej Johar*, 2018 judgment holds special relevance for transgender rights as well as LGBTQ+ community in general.

However, this respite turned out to be short-lived, since the Transgender Persons' (Protection of Rights) Act, 2019 completely undermined the concept of 'self-identification' guaranteed by the NALSA judgment. Thus, the lacunae within the law provides us an opportunity to re-visit and expand our understanding of gender and identity.

With the existing legal background, it is essential to perceive this issue holistically to gain an overall understanding of the rights of the transgender and other sexual communities. This has to be done by a thorough understanding in the social, cultural, economic and psychological backdrop of the concerns regarding the issue. Hence, in order to understand their 'Environment' it becomes all the more important to study the same through a multi-disciplinary approach. This can go a long way in including the Rights of Transgender community within the narrative of gender identity.

AIM:

The 6th RGNUL Multi-Disciplinary Congress on Rights of Transgender Community is an attempt to initiate a multi-dimensional dialogue on Rights of Transgender Community.

ABOUT MULTI-DISCIPLINARY CONGRESS (MDC)

The Multi-Disciplinary Congress (MDC) was an initiative of Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, Punjab (RGNUL), which was taken in 2011 to promote holistic research ideas and inter-disciplinary research on different issues.

In 2011 and 2013, the MDC was organized in collaboration with Indian Council of Social Sciences Research – Northwestern Regional Centre (ICSSR-NWRC), Chandigarh. In 2015, the 3rd MDC was held in collaboration with African Court on Human and Peoples' Rights, Tanzania. GUIDELINES FOR RESEARCH PAPER

- 1. The participants have to submit their abstracts (maximum 300 words) with keywords, clearly mentioning the objective and research methodology of the paper.
- 2. Co-authorship upto only 2 authors is allowed.
- 3. The abstract must be accompanied by a brief profile of the author(s) indicating his/her Email ID, contact number and official address.
- 4. Full Paper shall be between 2500-3000 words.
- 5. It must be typed in Times New Roman with Font Size 12 on A4 size paper with 1" margin on all sides with 1.5 line spacing using MS Word application.
- 6. Chicago style of citation should be followed.
- 7. The papers should be the original work of the author(s). Any kind of plagiarism will lead to disqualification. The papers published elsewhere or selected/submitted for publication elsewhere shall also be disqualified.

The author(s) will be solely responsible for any claim, suit or damages based on copyright infringement, unauthorized use or plagiarism. The University will not be liable for any such claim.
