This interactive segment saw enthusiastic participation from faculty, staff, and students, who shared personal insights and discussed the ongoing significance of Ambedkar's ideals in legal education and social transformation.

The day serves as a reminder of Ambedkar's lifelong commitment to eradicating social inequities and promoting the principles of liberty, equality, and fraternity. Through such conventions, RGNU reaffirms its dedication to nurturing these values within its academic and social environment.
